9	For what purpose or project is the grant requested?	The first Girlguiding units opened in Cranbrook 10 years ago in May 2013. We are requesting funds to enable us to subsidise a special "10th Birthday" activity evening at the Bear Trail (nr. Cullompton) which we hope to hold this term and which will be open to all of our current Rainbows, Brownies and Guides. We are also requesting funds to purchase customised items for 2 new local girlguiding units which closed due to Covid but have recently reopened. Maximum 100 words
10	What are the project's aims?	Our current funding request aim is to celebrate and reflect on the past 10 years of Girlguiding in Cranbrook as well as ensuring that our newest units are fully equipped to run their meetings at a standard and cost equal to the more established groups. (a) Bear Trail "10 th Birthday" Event "The Bear Trail" is a local outdoor activity course with climbing frames, zipwires etc. in a safe and well-

maintained environment. We plan to hire the site to bring all 100 local Rainbows, Brownies and Guides together for an evening session where they can challenge themselves with the activities while celebrating our 10-year milestone. The funds requested are to subsidise half the total cost of this to make it more affordable for all that wish to attend.

(2) Unit flag and neckerchiefs

Our 2nd Cranbrook Brownie unit opened in 2018 but closed in 2020 due to Covid and the leaders then moving away. It has recently been reopened by a group of local volunteers and we are requesting funds to purchase a Girlguiding flag for the unit (for use in ceremonies, St George's Day parades etc.) as well as neckerchiefs in the bespoke unit colours. These were not previously purchased by the unit in its early days due to their income being focussed on covering running costs with insufficient reserves available to cover items such as these.

(3) Uniform for new recruits

We have recently recruited a number of new volunteers to help our Girlguiding units to grow and we are requesting funds to provide them each with a regulation uniform top for use during meetings, events etc.

11 Please evidence demand for this project:

There is a clear demand for youthbased groups in Cranbrook (and surrounding areas) as shown by high membership (and long waiting lists) for our Girlguiding units in the local area. Our activities are open to all girls, regardless of their background, and all costs associated with our regular weekly meetings (hall hire, insurance and materials) are funded through our termly subscriptions of around £35 per term. This makes the sessions affordable to most and significantly cheaper than other non-voluntary organisations. However, our budget does not provide us with sufficient reserves to fully cover large-scale events or additional capital costs.

		
		For the Bear Trail trip in particular, we are acutely aware that the summer term is already an expensive time for families having to pay for school trips, residentials etc. In addition, our Girlguiding members are from a wide range of financial backgrounds and we do not want any child to be excluded from an activity due to the costs involved. We would therefore like to be able to cover half of the cost for each child to make it more affordable and are therefore requesting 100 x £6 = £600 to cover half the cost of the evening.
		For the uniform items, we have been very lucky to recently recruit a few new volunteers to help run our Girlguiding groups. These people give up their time for free each week and we would like to be able to provide them with suitable uniform (which is usually expected to be paid for by the volunteers themselves). 12	If the total cost of the project is more than the grant, how will the residue be financed?	The outstanding £600 will be covered by requesting a £6 per child contribution from the parents of each of the 100 children attending the Bear Trail event.
13	How is financial sustainability being achieved in the long term?	These events and items are supplementary to our usual unit running costs which are budgeted for and covered by our termly subscriptions of ~£35 per child per term.

15	How will the community benefit from the project?	The Girlguiding community groups will benefit from the sense of togetherness and inclusion that being part of a largescale event such as the planned Bear Trail evening. By making this affordable

		to our members we are also ensuring that no child is excluded due to financial pressures.
		Our customised flag and neckerchiefs will be used to promote our Cranbrookbased activities at external events within Exeter (and potentially more widely in Devon) which leads to a sense of belonging within our community.
		Providing each of our volunteers with a compulsory uniform item for use during meetings and events will ensure that all of our volunteers (both new and old) are able to represent their community in upcoming face-to-face events wearing a smart uniform without being penalised financially.
