TOWN CENTRE CONSULTATION RESPONSE

Introduction

East Devon District Council are consulting on the town centre in Cranbrook until 10 November 2023. This report sets out the Town Council's draft responses to the consultation questions.

PART 1 OF THE CONSULTATION

Question 1

This first question is about buildings which East Devon District Council and other public organisations already plan to build. Which are most important to you? Sort from most to least important.

- 1. Health and wellbeing centre (including GP surgery)
- 2. Town hall
- 3. Youth centre
- 4. Children's centre
- 5. Fire station
- 6. Library
- 7. Leisure centre and swimming pool

Question 2

How important to you are other facilities that may be suitable for Cranbrook town centre?

Please rate each of these facilities from not important at all (1) to very important (5).

Town square – can hold events, markets and is a place for people to sit and meet: 5

Wider range of shops: 3

Places to eat - restaurants and cafés: 5

Bars and pubs: 4

Cinema: 1

Housing for older or vulnerable people: 3

Temporary/adaptable spaces – for shops, crafts, food, work: 5

Small workshops: 2

The Town Council had been in conversations with the East Devon New Community partners and East Devon District Council in the past regarding the location of the Town Council's town centre building The Tillhouse and its location on TC2 opposite the town square and set back from Tillhouse Road so that a smaller public open space on TC2 to the south of The Tillhouse building can form a complementary part of the town square south of Tillhouse Road. The Town Council would like to preserve that location and the complementary part of the town square.

The Tillhouse building will also include the Country Park Officer accommodation and a direct pedestrian link from the building to the Country Park would be advantageous.

Infrastructure/units to support the service economy, e.g. hairdressers, to provide services which cannot be purchased online.

The Town Council is concerned that the survey does not allow for any qualification of response to the above question. For example, the leisure centre and swimming pool are linked and whatever weight is applied to one is automatically applied equally to the other. A leisure centre is far more important than a swimming pool. There are swimming pools in Exeter and the cost of a pool in Cranbrook is not achievable. Therefore, the inability to deliver a pool will constrain the delivery of the leisure centre if they remain linked – and it is not possible for the respondent to separate the two. The Town Council would place a leisure centre much higher than a swimming pool.

Question 3

Add something else: Infrastructure/units to support the service economy, e.g. hairdressers, to provide services which cannot be purchased online. It is not possible to comment on how public toilets should be provided and East Devon District Council will likely assume that if the Town Council support this facility, the Town Council will assume responsibility for those – which is not the case. A library and the supermarket could be the location of public toilets just as easily as a Town Council building.



Weekly, or permanent market spaces offers opportunities for businesses to sell goods to local people, with very little overhead. It is ideal for small-scale arts and craft producers, and food retailers. Depending on the demand from local residents, the market could operate in the evenings, weekends, or with a permanent presence.

A space for a small market is included with the town square that is being built at the moment between Tillhouse Road and the supermarket, but there are opportunities for including further space on other land.
